- You rarely need to show your Social Security card
- Knowing your Social Security number is what is important
- Many organizations can verify your Social Security number directly with the Social Security office
- Social Security offices only issue three replacement SSN cards in a year, and ten in a lifetime unless you meet an exception

Foreign Visa/Passport Assistance

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What to do if you lost your visa/passport:

- 1) **File Police Report:** State that your documentation was lost in a fire
 - i. Midvale Non-Emergency Police numbers:

 - ii. Option to file online: <https://unifiedpoliceut.gov/online-police-report/>
- 2) **Get New Passport:** You will need a new passport from your home country. Contact your embassy in the United States and let them know what happened. You may be asked to provide Police Report. A list of foreign Embassies and Consulates located in the United States. can be found here:

- 3) **Report Lost Visa:** Contact the U.S. Embassy/Consulate in the country where the visa/passport was issued:
 - a. State what happened and provide the police report number
 - b. They will provide you with instructions on how to reapply
 - c. Note: *Once your visa is reported as lost, damaged or stolen to the U.S. Embassy or Consulate that issued it, **the visa will be canceled.*** Even if your visa is recovered, it will no longer be valid once reported.

Generally, an individual is allowed to stay in the United States until the date on the I-94 document that was issued upon entry to the United States by an immigration official. This is known as “duration of status.” If you are unsure about the date on your I-94, contact U.S. Customs Immigration and Border Patrol.
